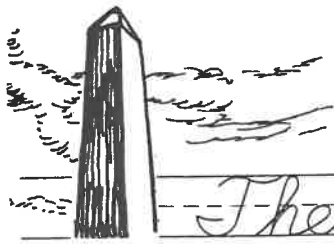


The Pledge of Allegiance

The Pony Express

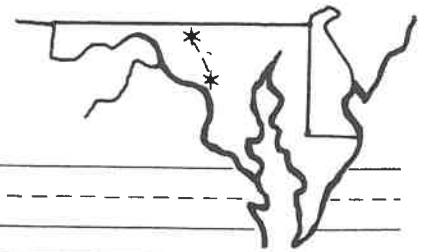
The Pony Express was an amazing mail delivery service that carried mail across the 1,966 miles between Missouri and California.

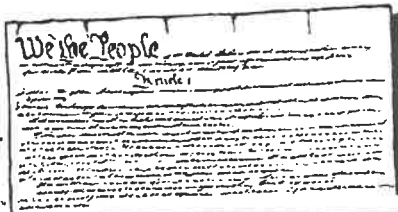


Camp David

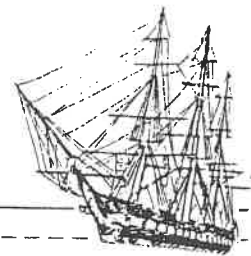
The Constitution

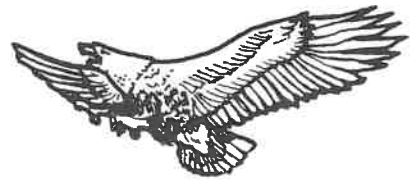
The Library of Congress

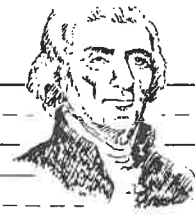


The American Eagle
